Parents are very welcome to join us for this event.

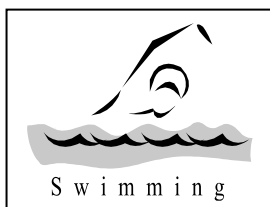
Middle School Swimming Carnival
